HAULED WATER RESOURCES FOR THE AGUA DULCE AREA

September 30, 2016

On September 13, 2016, the County of Los Angeles directed Rain Maker, a water hauler primarily serving the Agua Dulce area, to discontinue pumping water from its well. This action was due to a provision in Rain Maker's conditional use permit which sets a level of 55 feet below ground surface as the limit to which they may pump water, and Rain Maker has exceeded this limit. This limit was previously determined by a hydrologist to be the level at which pumping must be stopped to avoid potential impacts to other wells in the surrounding area. Rain Maker is able to resume pumping when the water level in the well rises to a level above 55 feet below ground surface. Note, although Rain Maker is not able to pump water from its well at this time, it may decide to secure water for its customers and continue service through an alternate approved source.

For your information the County has identified two other water haulers located in Acton capable of providing water service to the Agua Dulce area. Los Angeles County does not recommend any specific potable water hauler and is providing this information as options for residents affected by this action to consider.

Residents may/may not experience an increase in the cost of water and you may want to check with several haulers to compare prices. Neither Los Angeles County nor the California Department of Public Health have the authority to regulate the price charged for hauled water.

The California Department of Public Health, Food and Drug Branch permits potable water haulers. All three of the water haulers listed above were permitted as of September 1, 2016.
