World Hepatitis Day - Los Angeles Press Conference

Hosted by Hep B Free and the Hepatitis C Task Force for Los Angeles County

WHAT: World Hepatitis Day is July 28. The World Health Organization and the World Hepatitis Alliance have announced that the 2015 campaign theme is the prevention of Viral Hepatitis, which affects 400 million people worldwide. Working with these global organizations and the US Department of Health and Human Services, Hep B Free and the Hepatitis C Task Force of Los Angeles County are co-hosting a press conference to educate Angelenos about viral hepatitis and to make Hepatitis B and C screening the standard of care for at-risk populations. Additionally, JWCH Institute, with support from the LA County Department of Public Health, will offer free on-site testing for Hepatitis A, B, C, HIV and sexually-transmitted infections from 10:30AM to 1:00PM.

WHY: Hepatitis B virus causes up to 80% of all liver cancers worldwide, and Hepatitis C causes a majority of liver cancers in the United States. Combined, viral Hepatitis affects up to 5.3 million Americans and can lead to premature death and disability. But, there is hope! For Hepatitis B, there is a vaccine available and, for those already living with chronic Hepatitis B, medications that safely and effectively reduce viral load. For Hepatitis C, new treatments offer high cure rates with minimal side-effects. The most important thing is for people to know their status by getting tested! Be tested, Be vaccinated, Be treated! It could save your life!
