November 2022 Update: After the May 6th South Coast Air Quality Management Notification of Release of Hazardous Substance at Sterigenics Facility



UPDATE, as of November 14, 2022:


South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) continues air monitoring near the Sterigenics buildings as well as multiple locations within the community. SCAQMD continues to report that measurements of ethylene oxide in the residential community near Sterigenics are similar to other parts of the Los Angeles region and below health risk levels established by the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) (see orange dot on chart above). In contrast, ethylene oxide measurements just outside the facility still may present a health risk for nearby workers, see Figure 4 on SCAQMD's website. Based on current available data, investigations are still focused on ethylene oxide levels inside and immediately around the facility. The City of Vernon Health & Environmental Control Department (HECD), the local Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) is also required to regulate the Sterigenics facility in accordance with State and local laws and report the facility's compliance with statewide standards.

Public Health, SCAQMD, HECD, and OEHHA continue working together to keep the community informed and to protect the health of offsite workers. The workgroup will notify the community of any levels of concern or needed actions as appropriate.

BACKGROUND:

On May 6, 2022, SCAQMD notified Public Health and the general public that air monitoring detected elevated levels of ethylene oxide on-site at Sterigenics, located at 4900 Gifford Avenue in the City of Vernon.

HEALTH FACTS:

Ethylene Oxide is a gas used in the facility to sterilize medical equipment. It has a sweet, but pungent chemical odor. Short-term exposure to ethylene oxide in humans can irritate the eyes, nose, throat, and lungs. Long-term exposure can cause damage to the brain and nervous system. Ethylene oxide has been linked to cancer in humans, including breast and blood cancers.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO PROTECT YOURSELF?

At this time, no specific action is required within the community. SCAQMD and HECD continue to work with nearby worksites.
