In the Spotlight - Expanding Comprehensive Dementia Care

The John A. Hartford Foundation awarded two grants to support a partnership between the Education Development Center (EDC), the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA), and the Benjamin Rose Institute on Aging to engage GUIDE participants and non-GUIDE programs in expanding evidence-based comprehensive dementia care. This project titled <u>"Expanding Evidence-Based Comprehensive Dementia Care"</u> will contribute to the work being done through the National Dementia Care Collaborative (NDCC).

The project aims to help GUIDE participants succeed and thereby provide evidence for establishing GUIDE-model care as a permanent Medicare benefit. It will also create pathways to extend evidence-based dementia care to Medicare Advantage beneficiaries through adoption of established models and further support national dissemination of evidence-based dementia care.
