

Los Angeles County Infant Mortality, Preterm Births, and Birthweight 2010 Factsheet



*Infant Mortality Rate: Infant deaths occurring at less than 365 days per 100 live births.


- The Healthy People 2020 Objective is to reduce the infant mortality rate to no more than 6.0 per 1,000 live births.
- The infant mortality rate for Los Angeles County has remained stable around 4.6 to 5.5 with an average of 5.1 infant deaths per 1,000 live births between 2000 and 2010.
- In 2010, African Americans comprised 7.7% (10,237) of all 133,160 live births in Los Angeles County and 16.2% (100) of all 617 infant deaths.
- The infant mortality rate for African American babies in Los Angeles County is twice as high as the overall Los Angeles County rate and three times that of White babies.
- Fourteen percent of African American babies in Los Angeles County were born preterm compared to 8.9% of Asian/Pacific Islander babies which has the lowest rate of preterm in 2010.
- Service Planning Area 1 and 6 in Los Angeles County have the highest rate of preterm births at 12.0% and 11.4% compared to 10.1% of countywide.
- The low birthweight rate in Los Angeles County has steadily increased in the past decade from 6.4% in 2000 to 7.3% in 2010.
- Service Planning Area 1, 6, and 8 in Los Angeles County have the highest rates of low birthweight at 9.1%, 8.5% and 8.0% compared to 7.3% of countywide.


