





Delta and Omicron Variants among LAC Residents Reported to Public Health









7-Day Cumulative Age-Adjusted Hospitalization Rates per 100,000 by Vaccination Status* June 1st – December 13th, 2021







Updated Isolation/Quarantine Guidance for the General Public

Requirement	Any individual exiting isolation after day 5 has a negative test on day 5 and is asymptomatic or symptoms have improved and they are fever free.
Requirement	Any individual exiting quarantine after day 5 has a negative test on day 5 and is asymptomatic.
Requirement	 Asymptomatic adults leaving isolation or quarantine after day 5 (with a negative test) should wear a medical grade mask (surgical or respirator) around others, indoors and outdoors, for the next 5 days. Children should wear a non-cloth mask of multiple layers of non-woven material with a nose wire.
Requirement	Close contacts who are unvaccinated or eligible and not yet boosted must quarantine for the minimum 5 days.
Requirement	In establishments or settings with active outbreaks, quarantine and isolation periods may be extended by DPH for additional days to help control transmission risk.
Ability	Businesses or establishments need to comply with Cal/OSHA standards. They may be more conservative than Cal/OSHA and continue with current isolation and quarantine periods.

Ringing in the New Year Safely



Testing Achievements and Challenges

- 1.4 million OTC test kits provided by the state being distributed in January to LAC public schools with partners at the LA County Office of Education
- Public Health distributed 700,000 OTC test kits to 350 CBOs to allocate to residents in high-need communities
- Although it remains challenging to find tests for many, at-home test collection is available if symptomatic or exposed to a known case
- Reminders:
 - While OTC tests are slightly less reliable than PCR/molecular tests, they are very useful for timely status checks
 - If you have symptoms and test negative on an OTC test, isolate until you can get a PCR test


