

THIRD DOSE?

OR

BOOSTER?

People with very weak immune systems may not build enough protection after two doses. A third dose is recommended.

Who should get a third dose?

People with moderately or severely compromised immune systems including those:

- Being treated for cancer
- With advanced HIV
- With chronic kidney disease
- Taking drugs that weaken (or suppress) the immune system

Ask your doctor if you should get a 3rd dose and the best time to get it based on your treatment plan

Get a third dose vaccination 28 days or more after your 2nd dose of Pfizer or Moderna

Extra doses are not authorized or recommended for people who got the J&J vaccine yet. Experts expect they will be needed but the data is still being reviewed.

Booster shots are common and given for many vaccines. Think about tetanus boosters that adults get every 10 years.

Who should get a booster?

Booster shots are available for people who received their **2nd dose of Pfizer vaccine at least 6 months ago** and are:

- Age 65+
- Age 18+ and live in a long-term care facility
- Age 18+ and have an underlying medical condition
- Age 50+ and at increased risk due to social inequities
- Age 18+ and live or work in a high-risk setting

To get a booster, book an appointment on MyTurn.ca.gov

People who got the J&J or Moderna vaccines are likely to need booster doses, but they have not been authorized or recommended for these two vaccines yet.
