

How Does Contact Tracing Work?

Contact tracing is a simple, confidential process that has been used by public health departments for decades to slow the spread of infectious diseases and avoid outbreaks. You can do your part by answering a few simple questions.

- If you get a call from Public Health, it is important to take this call. It will show on your phone as "LA PublicHealth" or 1-(833) 641-0305.
- If you receive a Los Angeles County Health Officer Order and have not already had a contact tracing interview, you must call the number on the Order within 24 hours.
- The Public Health Specialist can answer your questions and provide you with information such as how to get a COVID-19 test, find a doctor, or get help while you are in quarantine or isolation.

If you test positive for COVID-19:



Public Health will ask:

1. About the places you have been.
2. The people you have been around while you were infectious.

- The people you tell Public Health about will be contacted but will not be told your name, contact information, or that you have COVID-19. They will not be told anything about you, just that they were exposed to COVID-19.

If you have been in contact with someone with COVID-19:



Public Health will ask:

1. If you have any COVID-19 symptoms or if you have been tested.
2. About places that you may have been to.

- In order to avoid you getting mixed up with another person, please give your complete and correct information.
- Public Health may call you more than once to check how you are doing.
- They will give you information on next steps based on your answers.
