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Antelope Valley Partners for Health (AVPH) is a nonprofit organization located in Lancaster serving the needs of atrisk families and all community members through direct services and building community capacity. In serving the needs of the community, collaboration is a key ingredient in the success of AVPH's Food Pantry. In establishing partnerships with South Antelope Valley Emergency Services (SAVES), Trader Joe's in Palmdale, Meet Each Need with Dignity (MEND) in Pacoima and Food Forward in Hollywood, AVPH has been a recipient of an abundance of fresh produce that enables us to provide the community more access.

This is just one of the many commendations that AVPH Food Pantry received from the hundreds of community members who participate in the bi-monthly food distribution program scheduled every 2nd and 4th Friday of the Month. Since August of 2017, we have served 1,500 individuals and received donations of approximately 10,000 pounds of fresh produce through this program.

We have improved our food distribution system from the traditional "boxed" food distribution to "client's choice" where people can choose food items

according to their needs and not be forced to take foods that they are not familiar with preparing. During food distributions, we have offered additional services such as healthy food demonstrations, nutrition classes, on-site Calfresh and Medi-Cal enrollment services and information on 211 L.A. County.
