<p><b>Action Items from Last Meeting: Updates on Mini Grant</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• WIN mini-grant update: On April 11<sup>th</sup> they gave out 300 to 350 (50 families served) food items from Everytable by online sign- up. Resources were added to their meal give-away. Thirty families received \$35 gift card.</li> </ul> <p>Manhood 2.0 fatherhood series will begin soon. They have 1 more orientation for before the series start. They are recruiting fathers from Best-Start and Willowbrook area at large. The curriculum focusses on gender equity, balance with parental roles and self-development. There will be 7 sessions in total. The participates who have attended the orientation are looking forward to the series, WIN is getting great feedback about the series from the community. The Fatherhood series are a good opportunity to expand networks in the community to get more men engage in the area, which is WIN's goal. <b>The community has been helpful with food distribution, outreach and peer-to-peer marketing of the program.</b> Anyone can make a referral to WIN that identifies as male to participate in the classes.</p> <p>Reggie requested more toys for ages kinder to junior high school.</p>	<p align="center">Reggie Johnson, WIN</p>	<p align="center"><b>Steering committee</b></p>

<b>Community Partnership Updates</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• During WIN’s update Watts Healthcare YEPP (Tenesha Taylor) offered to donate her excess of CARE package for fitness that include stress balls, resistant ropes etc. to give to his families. She also has mask to share with other CAP partners for the for their staff and families. Britney Chine (Nickerson Gardens Housing Development) also requested to have some fitness CARE package to distribute to some of her families. Tenesha coordinated with Reggie and Britney to drop of CARE packages about 35 packages will be split between the two.</li> <li>• Watts HealthCare YEPP Lifeskills update: This is the last week of the Lifeskills sessions. The last week is on financial literacy. Today’s topic is will be on credit, “Credit isn’t Free Money.” Feedback from the community saying it is great that youth are learning about credit at a young age. It helps young people plan. Each session there is an incentive, participants receive by play a virtual wheel that selects a winner.</li> <li>• LA COUNTY Libraries are having virtual story times. Due to COVID-19 park’s schedules are limited to the families, therefore, a Youtube channel was created, “parks at home” to engage children and youth. Youth pick-up activity packets once a week and park staff connect live on Instagram with their children and youth participants. The 2<sup>nd</sup> week in June the summer program will begin. There are about 30 families that are participating in the program.
