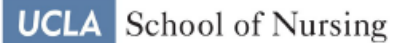

## 2018 World TB Day Events

### **Boyle Heights Neighborhood Health and Education Fair at the LAC USC Wellness Center.**

On Saturday, March 17<sup>th</sup> Tuberculosis Control Program (TBCP) staff and members of the coalition attended the Boyle Heights Health Fair. This event was hosted by both the Boyle Heights Health Neighborhood and the LAC USC Wellness Center to celebrate the 4th anniversary of the Wellness Center. 200 people came to the resource table for information and approximately 45 risk assessments were completed.



### **Mar Vista Certified Farmers Market**

On Sunday, March 18<sup>th</sup> TBCP staff and members of the coalition attended the Mar Vista Farmers Market. With upwards of 400 individuals in attendance at this market, team members passed out 250 tote bags with TB educational materials and resources inside.



### **TB 101: Train-the-Trainer**

On Monday, March 19th the TBCP and Coalition to End TB held a TB 101: Train-the-Trainer workshop for 15 individuals at the California Endowment. The goal of this training was to “engage and train key DPH staff on Tuberculosis control and prevention in order to extend the reach of the Tuberculosis Control Program’s community outreach efforts to raise awareness about this disease and its impact locally”.



### **PharmSC Health and Resource Fair**

On Saturday, March 24<sup>th</sup> TBCP staff attended the PharmSC Health and Resource Fair hosted by the USC School of Pharmacy. This event was geared towards residents of the William Mead Homes, a public housing development, located near Chinatown.
